

## 4.3 Possessive Pronouns

We can use possessive pronouns (*mine, yours, his, hers, ours, theirs*) to show ownership or relationship.

POSSESSIVE ADJECTIVE	POSSESSIVE PRONOUN	EXPLANATION
<p>Her dress is white. Their wedding was big. We had our wedding in a church.</p>	<p>Mine is blue. Ours was small. They had theirs in a garden.</p>	<p>When we omit the noun, we use a possessive pronoun. <i>mine</i> = my dress <i>ours</i> = our wedding <i>theirs</i> = their wedding</p>
<p>The groom's parents look happy.</p>	<p>The bride's do too.</p>	<p>After the possessive form of a noun, we can omit the noun. <i>The bride's</i> = the bride's parents</p>
